

The Center for Children and Women uses a “Sliding Scale Method” to determine discount percentage amounts to be considered as charity care assistance for eligible patients utilizing the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) Income Guidelines:

2021 Federal Poverty Level Guidelines

Families at or below 100% of the FPL generally qualify for Medicaid  
Families at or below 200%, but above 100% of the FPL generally qualify for CHIP

**Discount Assistance:**

**75% Discount off standard fee schedule for all office services**

Gross Income equal to or less than 100% of the Federal Poverty Guideline.

**50% Discount off standard fee schedule for all office services**

Gross Income is between 101% and 200% of the Federal Poverty Guideline.

**25% Discount off standard fee schedule for all office services**

Gross Income is between 201% and 400% of the Federal Poverty Guideline.

Or if guarantor has out-of-pocket medical expenses of more than 25% of gross income in any one calendar year.

<b>Example:</b>	
Annual Income (monthly x 12)	\$28,000
Family Size	4
FPL	> 100% v <200%
Discount Assistance	50%

**Note:** In this example, the patient should qualify for CHIP coverage. So, be sure to involve your Social Worker or Enrollment Specialist
